




Greetings IASCOE Members,

There can be no question that even though its cold outside, we are in the heat of it, inside FSA. With that heat comes pressure, frustration, and stress, but also hopefully some excitement and exhilaration as we get the job done.

I know that software continues to be an issue that challenges our offices and I continue to engage the national office on this. Unfortunately, as both we and the rest of the US continue to put pressure on our software systems, we will likely continue to experience impacts. Just this week I ran into a crop insurance company executive who relayed the same frustrations. Even in his private company, he described the people as the strongest link and the software as often times the weakest.

Because our strength inherently lies in our people, the State Office continues to work hard to support the field offices, particularly in trying to equip you with the needed resources to get the job done. Since my last update to you in October, we have completed 40 hiring actions and have 64 vacancies in progress (not including temporaries). We saw a large number of retirements at the end of 2019 and the Administrative department isn't letting off the accelerator in getting those back filled as quickly as we can. We had great news this month with the long-anticipated release of our permanent 2020 ceiling, which rose an additional 13 CO positions to 485. We will be adding some much-needed PTs in offices around the state that been stressed, and we will begin backfilling PT positions before a retirement takes place, if we have adequate notice to get the hiring action complete. Its been my hope since I started in this position, to be able to have some overlap for new PTs so they can be trained, at least in part, by the retiring PT. Thankfully, we are finally at a point where we can do that.



In addition, we have been able to deploy critical Temporary appointments as well as Overtime. I wish we had an unlimited amount of these resources, but the entire nation is under the same pressure we are. I am grateful we have a good start and that our COFs are getting additional help.

This is a big year for FSA and our farm bill implementation. Overall, I believe we are in as good of a position as can be expected, heading into the final days of CRP sign up and final weeks of 2019 ARCPLC. That is because of all your hard work, your extra hours, and your attention to detail to ensure it's done right the first time.

Keep up the good work and thank you for everything you do!



RASCOE LEGISLATIVE UPDATES FROM DAVID SENTER, FEB. 2020

I've been digging into the President's Budget proposal that impacts current and future retirees. Many of these proposals were in last years President's Budget that were rejected by Congress. RASCOE needs to keep an eye on these proposals because you never know what will happen in the dark of night while a deal is being worked out.

- 1. Current employees in the FERS System would increase by 1% per year the contribution the employee makes toward retirement until it reaches the government match. Estimates are that the increase will be about 6% for the average employee. For employees under the CSRS system would not be affected.
- 2. The Budget Proposal would eliminate the supplemental payment that applies only for FERS retirees that retire before age 62. The payment is equal to about what retirees would receive from Social Security benefits and is paid until the retiree reaches 62.
- 3. The Budget also would base a retiree's annuity on the high 5 not high 3 as it currently is.
- 4. The Annual Cost of Living adjustments would be cut for both FERS and CSRS retirees, Cost of Living adjustments for FERS would be eliminated and for CSRS the adjustment would be cut in half.
- 5. The President's Budget projects a \$53.6 billion cut for current and future retirees over 10 years.
- 6. In another section, the interest rate paid in the Government G Fund of the Thrift Saving Plan would be cut from 2% interest paid to 1% interest paid, costing employees and future retirees \$10.5 billion over 10 years.

We will follow developments and keep you informed. I think all RASCOE members should let you Members of Congress know that you expect them to protect the retiree benefits you earned.

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RASCOE

The National Association of Retired ASCS/FSA Office Employees (RASCOE) was formed in 1994 to promote the welfare of the association's members by alignment with other organizations and actively lobbying to maintain the integrity of retiree benefits. RASCOE Objectives are as follows:

- Seek legislation to abolish or amend the GPO & WEP provisions of the Social Security Law to allow retirees to receive full benefits earned
- Continuation of the FEHBP as now available and obtain the right to pay

- · Continuation of Medicare substantially in the manner as now authorized


